

The 2018 Annual Statistical Summary from the Internal Affairs Section is as follows:

CASES ASSIGNED

There were ten (10) cases assigned for formal investigation by Internal Affairs; those cases included allegations against seven (7) employees. It should be noted that one of the employees had five (5) cases in which he was listed as the subject officer. One case had more than one employee involved.

2018 ANNUAL CASE ANALYSIS

The total number of Internal Affairs cases decreased from twenty-one (21) in 2017 to ten (10) in 2018. We also experienced a decrease in both the external and internal cases. A comparison and statistical analysis show that the six (6) year average case load is thirteen (13) cases. Additionally, out of the ten (10) cases investigated in 2018, five (5) of the cases involved the same Police Supervisor. As a result of the investigations, the Police Supervisor was demoted to the rank of Police Officer.

After reviewing all cases investigated by the Internal Affairs Section, there does not appear to be a need to readdress any specific areas of policies and procedures.
