CALL TO ORDER:

Chairperson, Ray Airan called the meeting to order at 5:05 pm.

Rhonda Anderson joined the meeting via phone.

MOTIONS:

January 25, 2017 SAB meeting minutes – Sharon made a motion to approve the minutes with corrections. Roy seconded the motion, and the motion was unanimously approved.

Irela made a motion to that the Sustainability Advisory Board (SAB) request that the city commission instruct the City Attorney and the City Lobbyist to do everything necessary to defeat HB 17. Roy seconded the motion, the motion was unanimously approved.

MEMBER’S REPORT:

Marlin: stated that we've all been appointed by a different Commissioners we all have our different interest and it's amazing how we've taken on different projects. Electronic recycling project has been great 33,000 pounds we will have our next event on Earth Day April 22nd in the City Hall Parking Lot from 9am to 12pm there will also be paper shredding in partnership with the police department.

Roy: Updated the Board that our electric vehicle charging stations in the Parking Garages which are being tracked by Chargepoint have reported that there have been 1,600 charging sessions that equate to 204 gallons of gasoline being reduced and a savings of over 9 tons of greenhouse gas emissions. The City fleet of electric vehicles is a great success of its own we have 20 with 15 coming online later on this year. The City Manager stated that at the onset we started out with a Hybrid-Electric Trolley we found that there were problems with the start-and-stop mechanism and the trolley was not charging and it was not as successful so we migrated out of it. She stated that it's something that we can look back into with Steve Riley.

Irela: Matt and I met with Mark Trowbridge of the Coral Gables Chamber of Commerce, Javier and Jessica from the City to discuss the Green Business recognition program which resulted in a partnership with the Coral Gables Chamber of Commerce and businesses within the City of Coral Gables. As was discussed at previous board meetings, the program looks to recognize local business for their achievements in sustainability. The program focuses on six key areas: solid waste reduction & recycling, energy conservation, water conservation, transportation alternatives, and green innovation. The program also includes a plastic bag reduction pledge that encourages businesses to voluntarily move away from the use of single use disposable plastic bags. The plan to launch this program is projected for April "Earth Month". She proposes meeting with Whole Foods and Publix to support the program and possibly sponsor and/or provide incentives. The Coral Gables Museum is having a Green Garage Sale on March 11th, which the SAB will be participating in.

Enrique: Remarked on the color temperature of the lights used in the street lighting on the Streetscape projects and its impact on the residents.

Sharon: commented that she was made aware that some apartment buildings do have recycling. She stated that the City of Coral Gables has a beautiful green canopy.

Rhonda: met with Jessica Keller, Assistant Public Works Director to discuss permeable pavement. Jessica is incorporating request for the use of permeable pavement into developers plans that she is reviewing.

Ray: Updated the Board regarding sustainable roofing and wants City officials to be open minded concerning metal roofing, he commented that it has been met with resistance.

The City of Coral Gables City Manager, Cathy Swanson-Rivenbark presented to the SAB the City's 3-year Strategic Plan. Please see attached for the presentation.

Bike to Work Day at the Coral Gables Museum (March 3 7:30am-9am): The City is encouraging employees, residents, and businesses in downtown Coral Gables to bike to work on Friday March 3. The City is hosting a free event at the Coral Gables Museum (285 Aragon Ave). Please stop by for a free continental breakfast, music, and giveaways. The event is taking place from 7:30 to 9:00 am. The City in partnership with Miami-Dade County's BIKE305, Bike Walk Coral Gables, the Coral Gables Chamber of Commerce and the Coral Gables Museum are promoting the use of bicycles and public transportation as an alternative way to commute to work, school and other destinations. Bike to Work Day attendees will be able to preview the exhibit: "Plan Z for Miami: Repurposing Rickenbacker Causeway to Rickenbacker Park".

Coral Gables Museum Green Garage Sale (March 11). The SAB will have a table at the Green Garage Sale event educating visitors on the City's sustainability initiatives.

Coral Gables Bike Day (March 12): Transportation and Sustainability will have a table at the Bike Day event educating attendees on the City's sustainability and transportation initiatives.

University of Miami Green Fair (April 21): Matt stated that they are having their Green Fair on April 21st from 11am - 2pm. David and Matt will have a tent with a table and chairs to share sustainability and transportation information with attendees.

2017 Electronic Recycling Events: Matt has confirmed with STS Electronic recycling the dates for 2017. The first event is taking place on Earth Day Saturday April 22 from 9am-12pm in the City Hall Parking Lot. Great news is we will be partnering with the police department to offer sensitive document shredding as a part of the event as well. John Osgood is also trying to coordinate household hazardous waste collection to be included in the event as well. The second event is scheduled to take place on November 18 which is the first Saturday after America Recycles Day (November 15). There is an additional opportunity to schedule one additional event during the summer if needed, however last year the summer proved to be the lowest turnout in terms of weight of material collected.

The next SAB Meeting is taking place on March 22.
