Each year during Halloween, hundreds of people walk along the residential streets of Coral Gables and participate in traditional Halloween activities such as trick-or-treating.

This year, many residents have contacted me to express their concerns regarding Halloween festivities and stressed the importance of potentially having the city monitor and divert areas where a high volume of people congregate. Many of the concerned residents reside on streets like Santamaria Street. The purpose of monitoring streets like these is to minimize exposure to COVID-19 and refrain from activities that the CDC classifies as 'high risk' for spreading the virus.
